CHAPTER 196.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THREE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED DOL-LARS (\$3,100) OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF PRESTON, FILLMORE COUNTY, ISSUED BY THE SUPERVISORS OF SAID TOWN FOR BUILDING A BRIDGE ACROSS ROOT RIVER, AND THE TAXES LEVIED AND TO BE LEVIED FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the bonds of the town of Preston, Fillmore county, issued by the supervisors of said town to Z. King and Son; to the amount of three thousand one hundred dollars (\$3,100), bearing date the first (1st) day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875), and payable in two (2), three (3) and four (4) years from date, with interest annually at the rate of ten (10) per cent., issued for the purpose of building a bridge across Root River in said town, be and the same are hereby legalized and in all respects made valid.

SEC. 2. That the supervisors of said town be and are hereby authorized to cause taxes to be levied from year to year upon the taxable property of said town for an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as they mature, in addition to all other town taxes, and that the taxes levied in said town for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six (1876), for the payment of said bonds and interest, is hereby legalized and

made valid.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
