CHAPTER 225.

AN ACT TO PREVENT THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF CATTLE AND OTHER DOMESTIC ANIMALS IN THE COUNTY OF SIBLEY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section I. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to allow any cattle, horses, mules, asses, sheep, or swine, owned by them, or of which they may have possession or control, to run at large upon the public highways, or upon the lands of any other person, during any season of the year, unless properly herded. *Provided*, that a majority of the legal voters at any annual town meeting may, by resolution, allow such animals to run at large in their respective towns, except the townships of Henderson, Jessen Land, Faxon, Washington Lake, and Green Isle.

SEC. 2. The provisions of this act shall apply only to the county of Sibley, and shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and

seventy-seven (1877).

CHAPTER 226.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED 'AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER THIRTY-FOUR (34) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY (1870), AMENDING SECTION TWENTY-NINE (29) OF CHAPTER 'NINETEEN (19) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES, AND TO AMEND SECTION THIRTY-EIGHT (38) OF TITLE THREE (3) OF CHAPTER NINETEEN (19) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES, RELATING TO DISTRAINING BEASTS DOING DAMAGE,' AND TO AMEND CHAPTER EIGHTY-FOUR (84), GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX (1876)."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter eighty-four (84) of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year one
