The Revenue Fund, at the close of the last fiscal year, was overdrawn to the amount of \$19,476.96, and again it shows an overdraft of \$14,844.44, borrowed temporarily from other funds.

There is, however, due this fund the prison rent and labor for two quarters, which the contractors refused to pay, and which, for the corresponding quarters of last year, amounted to \$5,880.70.

Another feature, acting unfavorably on the condition of this fund, is the falling off in the tax receipts for the year 1876, of \$19,094.56 against the year 1875; and of \$132,465.33 against the year 1874.

MANNER OF PAYMENTS.

In submitting for your consideration my first annual report, I beg leave to call your attention to some matters which require action at your hands, in order to render the system of business routine established between the offices of State Auditor and State Treasurer more complete.

By the act of March 9th, 1874, the rule was established, that every payment from the treasury should be made on the warrant of the State Auditor, thereby securing a complete control of all disbursements. This rule, however, was set aside by the passage of Chapter 90, General Laws of 1875, which provides for the payment of a reward for the arrest and conviction of horse-thieves, as the amount paid out for this purpose by county treasurers is to be credited in their settlements with the State Treasurer, also, by the passage of Chapter 19, General Laws of 1876, providing for the payment of a bounty for wolves, and authorizing county auditors to draw orders direct upon the State treasury.

If it is deemed advisable to keep these laws in force hereafter, I would respectfully suggest that they be so amended as to conform to the rule originally established.

Now, if former experience can be taken as a basis for future estimates, a much larger amount will be needed for this purpose hereafter. By reference to the report of the State Treasurer for the year 1868, you will find that the amount paid out for wolf bounties, under a former law, was :

Showing for the second and third years of the existence of the law, such a remarkable increase, that we could safely estimate the expenditure for that purpose for the year 1877, at \$10,000, which, in view of other and more pressing demands upon the treasury, would be altogether out of proportion.

A forcible argument against the paying of a bounty for this purpose is furnished by the experience of the State of Wisconsin, where from September 30, 1867, to January 25, 1868,—in less than four months—the amount of \$16,660.00 was paid out for bounties, and the prospect of a steady increase of that expenditure, induced the Legislature to repeal the law by a nearly unanimous vote.

TAXES FROM RAILROAD COMPANIES.

By law, the State Treasurer is required to collect all taxes due from railroad corporations which pay a per centage of gross earnings in lieu

of other taxes, and the railroads report to the State Treasurer the amount of gross earnings; but in several instances I have found the data for the commencement of paying taxes unsettled, and out of which there existed a difference of opinion between myself and several railroad corporations.

Upon presenting my views to the Railroad Commissioner and Attorney General, I found they agreed with me, and upon pressing the matter, back taxes and interest was collected from the companies, amounting, in the aggregate, to \$8,178.19.

The fact that such omissions could occur, shows the necessity of a more thorough control of these important matters, and in my humble opinion the returns from railroad companies should be made direct to the Railroad Commissioner, and upon his report to the State Auditor, a draft for the amount ascertained could be placed in this office for collection, as in the case of counties.

PAYMENT OF STATE LOAN.

The amount of \$100,000.00, as part of the bonded indebtedness of the State, falls due July 1st, 1877, and as that amount has already accumulated and is invested in bonds, which could at once be turned over to the Permanent School Fund, from which the loan was made—I submit for your consideration the question whether it would not be judicious to authorize the Treasurer to redeem these bonds before maturity.

SCHOOL APPORTIONMENT.

As a matter of economy, as well as of common business propriety, I desire to call your attention to the fact that the apportionment of the School Fund could be more practically and economically distributed. Under the present system the apportionment is made and the warrants upon the State Treasury are sent to the different counties at about the same time when the March and October settlements between the State and county authorities take place; very frequently the warrants are then remitted to this office in payment of the settlement, but in very many cases the warrants are collected from the State treasury, and on the other hand the money for the settlements is forward by express to the State treasury, causing unnecessary expense and delay.

By an amendment to the act relating to the School apportionment, the State Auditor could be authorized to place a warrant for the amount due the State on the settlement into the hands of the State Treasurer, to the credit of the respective counties, and send warrant for the balance only of the School apportionment to the county treasurers.

METRIC SYSTEM.

The act of Congress approved July 27th, 1866, establishes the metric system of weights and measures in the United States, and directs the Secretary of the Treasury to furnish to each State one set of weights and measures of this system, to use as standards.

Under date of October 10, 1876, the Bureau of Weights and Measures at Washington notified his Excellency the Governor, that the set assigned to the State of Minnesota had been forwarded to his address, and on its arrival, as the custodian of the standard weights and measures, I received the same.

MILK MEASURE.

The standard measure for milk is by our statutes established at 282 cubic inches for the gallon, which differs materially from the U. S. standard gallon of 231 cubic inches; and, as application has been made to have milk measures tested, I would respectfully ask that the necessary appropriation be made to enable me to procure the proper standard, in accordance with the statutes.
