thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878), but after that date the costs, interests and penalties now provided by law, shall attach to and be charged against the taxes levied and assessessed upon such real or personal property.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect, and be in force from .

CHAPTER 80.

AN ACT TO RELIEVE PERSONS IN THIS STATE WHO HAVE SUFFERED FROM GRASSHOPPERS, BY EXTENDING THE TIME TO PAY THEIR TAXES UNDER SECTIONS SEVEN (7) OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SIX (156) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF 1877.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. All persons residing in this State who have complied with section six (6) of chapter one hundred and fifty-six (156) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and seuenty-seven, (1877,) may apply to the board of county commissioners of their respective counties at any session thereof, by a sworn statement that he or she is not able to pay said taxes as levied in accordance with section seven (7) of said act, in consequence of pecuniary inability; and said board of county commissioners may, upon due consideration of the facts as presented, extend the time for the payment of such taxes for a period of one year, and the county auditor shall thereupon notify the county treasurer of such county of the extension as given by said board of county commissioners, and he shall refrain from collecting said tax for that year.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and

after its passage.
