

CHAPTER 62.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER ONE OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN, RELATING TO THE INCORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF WATERTOWN, CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Section one (1) of chapter one (1) of the Session Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven (1877), relating to the incorporation of the village of Watertown, Carver county, Minnesota, is hereby amended by adding the following proviso to said section one (1), to-wit:

Provided, That the village so organized, together with so much of the territory of the town of Watertown, in said county of Carver, as may be designated or set apart by the supervisors of the said town of Watertown, shall form one road district, and the roadmaster thereof shall be appointed by the village council of the said village of Watertown, and all taxes raised within the limits of said village for road purposes shall be expended under the direction of the village council in said road district, but all bridges in said road district, shall be kept in repair and good traveling condition by the board of supervisors of the said town of Watertown.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 63.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION THREE (3) OF CHAPTER SIX (6) OF AN ACT OF THE LEGISLATURE OF MINNESOTA, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE INCORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTHFIELD, APPROVED FEBRUARY TWENTY-SIXTH (26TH), ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE (1875).

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section three (3) of chapter six (6) of the said act be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto at the end the following clause:

"And any person having served as fireman for the term of five (5) years shall be forever exempt from highway labor, poll-tax and from serving on juries within said city, and from military duty, except in case of war, insurrection or invasion."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
