

Forty-second—For payment of interest on temporary loans authorized by the legislature, two thousand dollars (\$2,000). Interest.

Forty-third—For payment of claim of Averill, Russell and Carpenter, fifty-six dollars and ten cents (\$56.10).

Forty-fourth—For payment of judges and clerks of election in election precincts in Kittson county in November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878), thirty-seven dollars (\$37.00).

Forty-fifth—For payment to the city of Saint Paul one-half the cost of constructing a sewer along the capitol grounds on Tenth street, between Wabasha and Cedar streets, whenever said sewer is completed, five hundred dollars, (\$500).

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 111.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE GENERAL EXPENSES OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT FOR THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY (1880).

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State treasury, belonging to the General Revenue Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the general expenses of the State government for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty (1880).

General appropriation bill for 1880.

First—For executive contingent fund for State purposes, and incidental expenses of the Governor's office, three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

Contingent funds.

Second—For incidental expenses of Secretary of State's office, three hundred dollars (\$300).

Third—For incidental expenses of the State Auditor's office five hundred dollars (\$500).

Fourth—For incidental expenses of State Treasurer's office, two hundred dollars (\$200).

Fifth—For incidental expenses and per diem as allowed by law, of the Attorney General, one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Sixth—For incidental expenses of the Adjutant General's office, two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250).

Seventh—For incidental expenses of the Insurance Commissioner's office, two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250).

Eighth—For incidental expenses and clerk hire of the Public Examiner, one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Ninth—For incidental expenses of the Railroad Commissioner's office, two hundred dollars (\$200, *Provided*, this shall be in lieu of all clerk hire.

Tenth—For incidental expenses of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, seven hundred dollars (\$700).

Eleventh—For incidental expenses of the State Library, three hundred dollars (\$300).

Twelfth—For incidental expenses of the Supreme Court, five hundred dollars (\$500).

Thirteenth—For the purchase of law books for the State Library, one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Fourteenth—For clerk hire for the Governor, twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200).

Fifteenth—For the purchase of paper for public printing, three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

Sixteenth—For the purchase of stationery for the Legislature and State officers, two thousand dollars (\$2,000).

Seventeenth—For the payment of costs in suits instituted by the Attorney General in behalf of the State, three hundred dollars (\$300).

Eighteenth—For printing and binding as provided by contract for the five (5) classes of printing and advertising for the various State officers and departments, seven thousand dollars (\$7,000).

Nineteenth—For selecting, examining and selling State lands, and making plats, and appraising pine timber and detecting trespass upon State lands, five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

Twentieth—For payment of expenses of requisitions for absconding criminals, one thousand dollars (\$1,000), payable upon the order of the Governor.

Twenty-first—For the support of the Minnesota Historical Society, three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

Twenty-second—For expenses of the State Board of Health, one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500).

Twenty-third—For payment of mileage of County Treasurers and express charges for the conveyance of State funds and bonds, one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Twenty-fourth—For rent of arsenal, three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350).

Twenty-fifth—For repairs and furnishing the State Capitol, three thousand dollars (\$3,000), to be expended under direction of the Governor.

Twenty-sixth—For fuel and lights, water, ice, etc., for the Capitol, three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

Twenty-seventh—For rebinding books in the State Library, one hundred dollars (\$100).

Twenty-eighth—For expenses of the State Board of Equalization, one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500).

Twenty-ninth—For extra clerk hire in State Auditor's office, one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500).

Thirtieth—For payment of claims for arrest and conviction of horse thieves, four thousand dollars (\$4,000).

Thirty-first—For payment of claims for wolf bounties, five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

Thirty-second—For expenses of Sheriffs conveying convicts to State prison, four thousand dollars (\$4,000).

Thirty-third—For fees of Registers and Receivers of United States land offices for furnishing abstracts of entries of public lands for taxation as provided by section one hundred and eighteen (118) of General tax law, one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Thirty-fourth—For payment of expenses of hatching and distributing fish, to be expended by the Fish Commissioners in accordance with the act providing for the culture and propagation of food fishes, five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

Thirty-fifth—For making plats of counties and limits of village and city corporations, and transcribing town organizations in the State, three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350).

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 112.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE PAYMENT OF DEFICIENCIES IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878.)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any money in the State treasury belonging to the general revenue fund not otherwise appropriated:

First—For deficiency in the appropriation for legislative expenses, seven hundred dollars (\$700.)

Second—For deficiency in the appropriation for the Senate court of impeachment, sixteen thousand three hundred and nine dollars and twenty-five cents (\$16,309.25.)
