

CHAPTER 67.

AN ACT IN RELATION TO THE GENERAL STATUTES OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), AND THEIR EFFECT AS EVIDENCE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The edition of the General Statutes and other public laws of this state in force at the close of the legislative session of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878), prepared by George B. Young, pursuant to chapter sixty-seven (67) of the General Laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878), shall be competent evidence of the several acts and resolutions therein contained in all courts of this state, without further proof or authentication.

SEC. 2. Said compilation shall be known and cited as "General Statutes, 1878."

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF PARTIES WHO RECEIVED SEED GRAIN UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER NINETY-FOUR (94) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT, (1878) ENTITLED "AN ACT TO FURNISH SEED GRAIN TO SUFFERERS FROM GRASSHOPPER RAVAGES."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter ninety-four (94) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878) are hereby suspended for one year, as against all persons who may be unable to pay for the seed grain received by them, under the provisions of said act, by reason of loss or damage of crops of the present, or of the ensuing year; *provided*, That all persons claiming relief under this act shall, on or before the first day of October of each year, file with the County Auditor an affidavit of loss or damage of crop and consequent inability to pay the one-half of his indebtedness to be levied against his property for such year, and to become due the ensuing year, with an endorsement thereon of two disinterested freeholders of the town in which the applicant resides, vouching for the truth of his statement.
