

CHAPTER 81.

AN ACT DECLARING IT UNLAWFUL TO GET ON OR OFF RAILROAD CARS AND ENGINES WHEN IN MOTION OR SWITCHING, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Unlawful to
get on or off
cars.

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, other than passengers or employees, to get on or off or to swing on or hang on from the outside of any engine or car upon any railroad while the same is in motion or switching.

SEC. 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall be fined in any sum not exceeding ten (10) dollars, of which violations Justices of the Peace and Judges of Municipal Courts shall have exclusive jurisdiction.

Duty of
officers.

SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of the Police Officers of any city and Constable and Sheriffs of any town or county in this State to arrest persons in the act of violating the provisions of this act, and take them before the proper magistrate and make complaint under oath of such violation, to the end that due punishment may be enforced for such violation.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force on the 1st day of April, 1879.

CHAPTER 82.

AN ACT RELATING TO THE ST. PAUL AND DULUTH RAILROAD COMPANY AND PROVIDING THAT THE PROVISION OF THE GENERAL STATUTES RELATING TO CONDEMNATION OF PROPERTY MAY APPLY TO SAID CORPORATION

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the St. Paul and Duluth Railroad Company the successor to the Lake Superior and Mississippi Railroad Company may perfect the title to the right of way for the use of said company by paying all amounts heretofore awarded for property for the purposes of said line of rail-
