

amended articles shall change the general nature of its business, or be operative or valid to alter, modify or change such original articles until the same shall be published and the certificate of the purposes for which said corporation is formed as set forth in such new or amended articles, in the same manner and with the like formalities that the original articles are now required to be published and the certificate thereof recorded, and, when so adopted, published, and the certificate aforesaid recorded, the said amended articles shall be substituted for and take the place of the original articles so amended.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION ONE (1) OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND ONE (101) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF MINNESOTA (REVISION OF 1866) RELATING TO THE SALE OF UNWHOLESOME PROVISIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter one hundred and one (101) of the General Statutes of Minnesota (Revision of 1866) be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Whoever knowingly sells any kind of diseased, corrupted or unwholesome provisions, whether for meat or drink, without making the same fully known to the buyer, or whoever having bought or come into the possession of any such diseased, corrupted or unwholesome provisions, shall offer or furnish the same or any part thereof as food or drink to any person or persons without first fully informing such person or persons to whom such provisions are offered, of the true condition of the same, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not more than six months, or by fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500), or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
