CHAPTER CCIII.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF GOODHUE COUNTY TO PERFECT AND TRANSCRIBE CERTAIN RECORDS IN HIS OFFICE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. The clerk of the district court of Goodhue county is hereby authorized and required to note upon his docket the satisfaction of all judgments therein entered which do not now appear by such docket to have been satisfied, but which have in fact been satisfied either by execution so returned or by duly executed instruments of satisfaction on file therein.

SEC. 2. The clerk of said district court is hereby further authorized and required to transcribe from the docket in his office designated "B" into the new docket by him about to be opened and designated "C" the entries of all judgments in said docket "B" which have been therein docketed since the first day of January A. D. eighteen hundred and sixty-nine and have not been satisfied.

Sec. 3. The said docket entries and said transcript, so made by said clerk in conformity with the provisions of this chapter, shall and are hereby declared to be of the like force and effect for all

purposes whatever as the originals thereof.

Sec. 4. The said clerk shall be allowed and shall receive for his said services, a fee of ten cents for each satisfaction by him noted, and the like fee for every docket entry by him transcribed as aforesaid, the same to be paid out of the treasury of said county upon the completion of said services.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after

its passage.
