

CHAPTER CCIV.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLASS COUNTY TO LEVY A TAX TO BUILD A JAIL.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The county commissioners of the county of Douglass are hereby authorized to levy a special tax not exceeding two and one-half mills on the dollar, for the purpose of erecting a suitable jail for the use of said county.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CCV.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE EMPLOYMENT OF A MARSHAL BY THE VILLAGE OF DULUTH.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The president of the village of Duluth shall have power to appoint a marshal for said village, whose term of office shall be during the pleasure of said president. Said marshal shall execute all orders made and perform such duties as may be prescribed by the village council for the collection of license money and fines, for the preservation of the public peace, for the good order, cleanliness and government of said village, and for all other purposes. He shall possess the powers of constables at common law and under the statutes of this State, and receive like fees for all duties performed by him, where fees are prescribed by law; and for all other duties performed by him he shall receive such compensation as may be allowed by the village council.

SEC. 2. This act shall have effect and be in force from and after its passage.
