

CCXX.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THE VILLAGE PLAT OF THE VILLAGE OF
BROWNSVILLE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the village plat of the village of Brownsville in the county of Houston and state of Minnesota, now on file in the office of register of deeds in said county of Houston, is hereby legalized and shall be recorded upon proper presentation, and thereafter shall be taken to be the legal plat of said village, for all intents and purposes.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER CCXXI.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THE PROCEEDINGS TAKEN FOR THE INCORPORATION OF "THE MONITOR PLOW WORKS" UNDER CHAPTER THIRTY-FOUR OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. *Whereas*, in the proceedings to organize the Monitor Plow Works as a corporation under chapter thirty-four of the general statutes of Minnesota, relating to corporations, publication of the articles of incorporation of said company was made for one week in a newspaper printed and published at the capital of the state, and such publication was made before said articles were filed with the secretary of state, and said articles were immediately thereafter filed with the secretary of state;

And Whereas, the same course of proceeding was adopted in publishing amendments to said articles of incorporation;

Now therefore be it enacted, that the said publication of the articles of incorporation of the Monitor Plow Works, and of the amendments to such articles, be and the same is hereby declared to be a substantial and sufficient compliance with the laws relating to such publication, and the acts of the said Monitor Plow Works, its stockholders, directors and officers, not inconsistent with their articles of incorporation and with the general laws of this state, are hereby legalized and made valid as the corporate acts of said corporation.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from the date of its passage,
