

## CHAPTER CCXXII.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THE ACTS OF ANN ONEILLE, GUARDIAN OF THE MINOR HEIRS AT LAW OF JOHN ONEILLE DECEASED, IN ASSINGING STATE SCHOOL LAND CERTIFICATES NUMBERS THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND SEVEN, AND TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN AND TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE LAND COMMISSIONER TO ISSUE PATENTS THEREFOR.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the assignment of state school land certificates numbers three thousand four hundred and seven and two thousand five hundred and sixteen respectively upon the north half of the northwest quarter and south half of the northwest quarter, of section number sixteen in township one hundred and thirteen, range twenty-five, by Ann Oneill, as guardian of the minor heirs at law of John Oneille, deceased, to John S. DeWolf, on the 8th day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight be, and the same hereby are declared and made legal and valid in all respects and for the purpose of obtaining patent therefore.

SEC. 2. Upon the presentation and surrender of said certificates to the land commissioner of the state of Minnesota, and upon the filing of a certificate from the auditor of the county of Scott that the taxes, interest and principal due the state of Minnesota for the same are fully paid, the land commissioner is hereby authorized and directed to execute to the said John S. DeWolf the patents for said land in due form of law.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER CCXXIII.

AN ACT TO LEGALIZE AN ISSUE OF BONDS BY THE CITY OF ST. CLOUD.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the bonds of the city of St. Cloud, in the county of Stearns, state of Minnesota, to the amount of ten thousand dollars, bearing date July 1, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, known as "Free Bridge Bonds," issued under and by authority of chapter seventy special laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, be and the same are [hereby] legalized and made valid in all respects.

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.
