

CHAPTER CCCVI.

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE SALARY, COMPENSATION AND FEES
OF COUNTY OFFICERS OF RICE COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The annual salary of the county auditor and county treasurer shall be fifteen hundred dollars each; *provided*, The annual salary of the deputy county auditor shall be one thousand dollars.

SEC. 2. The annual salary of the clerk of the district court shall be twelve hundred dollars and all fees collected or received by him over and above this amount shall be paid over to the county treasurer and be placed to the credit of the county revenue fund.

SEC. 3. The annual salary of the county attorney shall be eight hundred dollars and be paid as now provided by law.

SEC. 4. The annual salary of the judge of probate shall be eight hundred dollars and all amounts collected or received by him as pertaining to the duties of his office shall be paid over to the county treasurer and be placed to the credit of the county revenue fund.

SEC. 5. The fees of the sheriff shall be as now provided by law except that he shall receive for board and washing for prisoners confined in the county jail the sum of three dollars per week while so confined and for sums collected on an execution when the amount exceeds the sum of five thousand dollars he shall receive one per cent. only.

SEC. 6. The compensation of the county superintendent of schools shall be fixed by the board of county commissioners not exceeding the sum of five hundred dollars, and his duties shall be the examination of teachers and such other duties as the county commissioners shall direct.

SEC. 7. The annual salary of the register of deeds shall be fifteen hundred dollars and all fees collected or received by him over and above this amount pertaining to this office shall be paid over by him to the county treasurer and be placed to the credit of the county revenue fund.

SEC. 8. In addition to the salaries herein named, the board of county commissioners of said Rice county may allow to each or any of the said officers a reasonable compensation for clerk hire; *provided*, That in no case shall a greater sum than six hundred dollars be allowed for such clerk hire to any one officer.

SEC. 9. All acts and parts of acts fixing a different salary or compensation or prescribing fees differing from the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 10. This act shall take effect and be in force at the expiration of the term of offices of the several officers now holding the offices herein named.
