county, and said bridge when erected shall be kept in repair by Lac Qui Parle county and be forever free from tolls.

SEC. 2. That said bridge shall be located and built under the direction of the board of county commissioners, of said county of Lac Qui Parle, and no part of said appropriation shall be paid out of the state treasury until said bridge shall be completed and ready for travel.

SEC. 3. That when said bridge is completed the said board of county commissioners shall officially report to the state auditor, who shall, upon receipt thereof, draw his order in favor for the said sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700), belonging to said fund, and said board of county commissioners towards paying the expenses of constructing said bridge.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 210.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY OUT OF THE INTERNAL IM-PROVEMENT FUND TO BUILD A BRIDGE ACROSS BEAVER CREEK, IN MURRAY COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. That the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury belonging to the internal improvement fund, or out of the first moneys that shall come into the state treasury belonging to said fund, to build a substantial bridge across the creek known as Beaver creek, at or near the point where the center or quarter line of section ten (10), township one hundred and six (106), north of range forty-one (41) west, in Murray county, crosses the same; and that said bridge, when erected, shall be forever free from tolls, and shall be kept in repair by the town of Center, in which the same is situated, and the exact locality thereof shall be where the county road running north from Slayton crosses the same.

SEC. 2. That the said bridge shall be built and said money drawn and expended under the direction of the town supervisors of the town of Center, and no part of said appropriation shall be paid out of the treasury until said bridge is completed and ready for travel; and the certificate of said town supervisors, of the town of Center, shall be fficient evidence of that fact, but the state auditor may demand of id supervisors, vouchers for all expenditures made in the erection of id bridge and refuse to draw his warrant for the money hereby propriated, until said vouchers are furnished

SEC. 3. That upon the receipt of said certificate of the supervisors said town of Center, that said bridge has been constructed in a bod and substantial manner, and furnishing vouchers for the money eent thereon, said auditor shall draw his warrant upon the state easurer, in favor of said town supervisors, for the four hundred blars (\$400) hereby appropriated, or so much thereof as shall have een expended in the construction of said bridge, and the said supersors shall disburse and pay out the same to the various parties who ave furnished labor and provided material for the construction of id bridge and in full payment of the cost of said bridge.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after a passage.

That the sum of three hundred dollars (\$500), or so uch thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated out of the ternal improvement fund in the state treasury not otherwise approiated, or which may hereafter come into the state treasury to the edit of said internal improvement fund, for the purpose of building a bstantial bridge across the outlet of Lake Darling, in lot two (2), of tion six (6), township one hundred and twenty-eight (128), of range irty-seven (37), in said Douglas county. Said bridge when built, all be kept in repair by said county of Douglas, and shall be forever te of toll.

SEC. 2. That said bridge shall be built under the direction of the anty commissioners of Douglas county, and no part of said approlation shall be paid out of the treasury until said bridge shall be inpleted and ready for travel.

SEC. 3. John B. Cowing, Andrew Larson and Henry K. White, \cdot hereby appointed a committee on the part of the state to view said dge when completed, and to examine all contracts, vouchers and counts respecting its construction and the cost thereof, and to ascern and fix the cost of the construction of said bridge, and to make a
