for the following purposes: For the erection and completion of an additional building for the school for idiots and imbeciles and for heating and furnishing the same, thirty thousand (30,000) dollars; for connecting with gas mains the buildings for idiots and imbeciles and the building for the blind, with the Faribault city gas works, two thousand (2,000) dollars; for grading grounds and the erection of suitable shops for the use of the school for the deaf and dumb, ten thousand (10,000) dollars; for repairing the laundry and the building for the deaf and dumb, two thousand (2,000) dollars. Said money to be paid upon warrants How drawn. drawn by the president and countersigned by the secretary of said board of directors, and on the presentation of such warrants to the state auditor he shall draw warrants on the state treasurer for like amounts, payable to the treasurer of said board.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from When act to and after its passage.

CHAPTER 160.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE CLOTHING AND TRANSPORTATION FOR INDIGENT PUPILS OF THE MINNESOTA DEAF, DUMB AND BLIND INSTITUTE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That in all cases where persons sent to Minnesota deaf, dumb and blind institute are unable to furnish themselves with sufficient clothing and pay their expense of transportation to and from said institute, the probate judge of the county in which any such person resides, upon application of any relative or friend of such person, or of any officer of his town or county, shall, if he deem such person a proper subject for either the deaf and dumb, or the blind departments of said institute, and if in his judgment such person be unable to meet the necessary expenses of clothing and transportation, make an order to that effect to the superintendent of said department of the deaf and dumb, or the blind, as the case may be, who shall provide the necessary clothing and transportation at the expense of the county to an amount not exceeding forty dollars (\$40)

-how furnishper annum for every such pupil, and upon his sending his proper account therefor to the board of county commissioners of said county they shall audit the same, and the treasurer of said county shall pay the same as other county expenses.

CHAPTER 161.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A COMMISSION TO LOCATE AND PRE-PARE PLANS FOR A THIRD HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Authorized to appoint a commissioner, for what purpose.

When act to

take effect.

SECTION 1. That the governor is hereby authorized and required to appoint a commission, to consist of five persons, who shall locate a site for the third hospital for the insane at some point north of the south line of Anoka county, projected east and west to the limits of the state, in this state, which in their judgment is most available and suitable. Said commission may receive proposals from towns, cities or villages, or the inhabitants thereof, as to the donation of a site or the purchase thereof by the state, and decide upon the same in making said location.

To cause plans to be made and estimate of cost —to make report to legislature. SEC. 2. Said commission shall cause plans to be made of such hospital, and an estimate of the cost of the same under said plans, and shall report the same, together with a statement showing such location of such site, and the cost thereof, and any other facts of importance bearing upon the location and construction of such hospital to the legislature at its next session succeeding the present.

Compensation.

SEC. 3. Said commissioners shall each be entitled to receive five (5) dollars per day for not exceeding thirty (30) days, for each day actually spent in visiting localities for the purpose of selecting said site, or otherwise determining on said location, and shall be reimbursed for actual traveling expenses necessarily paid or incurred in or about the same.

Commission not to be interested in any contract. SEC. 4. That no member of said commission shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in the site chosen for said hospital, or in any contract that may hereafter be made for building and furnishing the same.
