CHAPTER 182.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWN OF CAMBRIA, IN BLUE EARTH COUNTY, MINNESOTA, TO MAINTAIN A FERRY ON THE MINNESOTA RIVER.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the board of supervisors of the town of Cambria, in Blue Earth county, Minnesota, and their successors in office shall have the right and privilege of locating and maintaining a ferry on the Minnesota river, between the towns of Cambria and Courtland. Said board of supervisors shall employ a competent man to operate said ferry, at a compensation not exceeding thirty-five (35) dollars per month, to be paid by the town treasurer upon the warrant of the chairman of said board of supervisors, attested by the clerk of said town of Cambria. Said ferry to be free to all foot passengers or persons with teams, or persons driving cattle, who are residents of said town of Cambria.

SEC. 2. The board of supervisors and their successors in office shall, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to, levy an annual tax on the taxable property of said town, over and above and in addition to all other taxes required by law to be levied, sufficient to pay the operating expenses of said ferry, which tax shall become due and collectible June first (1st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six (1886), and each succeeding year thereafter. Said tax shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes for county purposes are collected, and paid over to treasurer of said town of Cambria.

SEC. 3. That the question of levying tax for maintaining such a ferry shall be submitted to a vote of the electors at the annual town meeting of each year.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
