## CHAPTER 302.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR REDOCKETING JUDGMENTS IN THE OFFICE OF THE CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF MORRISON COUNTY, AND REFILING OF THE CASES THAT HAVE BEEN TRIED IN SAID COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the clerk of the district court of Morrison county, in the seventh (7th) judicial district, be and he is hereby authorized to transcribe and enter in new books, suitable for the purpose, all the district court cases now contained in the judgment docket of said county. Said cases, when transferred into a new book, shall have the force and effect of original docket entries; and to box and number consecutively, and properly index in a suitable book, kept by him for that purpose, all the cases on file in his office; and to do such other work in and about his office as may be necessary to put the records and files therein in proper order.

SEC. 2. That before any work shall be done by the clerk of the court of said county, under the provisions of this act, the judge of the district court of the seventh (7th) judicial district shall appoint three attorneys, residing in said county, whose duty it shall be to examine the present books and files kept in said office, any two (2) of whom concurring shall decide what records shall be transcribed, and what other work shall be done by said clerk in and about his said office; and who shall also decide what new books and material shall be procured by said clerk to be used by him in carrying out the provisions of this

act.

SEC. 3. That all the books and material necessary to be used by said clerk in carrying out the provisions of this act shall be paid for by said county, besides the compensation that will be due said clerk of the court for work done by him, under the direction and super-

vision of said attorneys.

SEC. 4. That said clerk shall be paid a just and reasonable compensation for the services required by him under the provisions of this act, after the same has been approved by the said attorneys, or any two of them. The said clerk's bill for the work that shall be done by him under the provisions of this act shall be approved by the said attorneys, or two (2) of them, and the judge of said court before the same shall be paid.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

passage.
