## CHAPTER 92.

AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS ONE (1), TWO (2) AND THREE (3) OF CHAPTER SIXTY-EIGHT (68) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE (1883)."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter sixty-eight (68) of the special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three (1883), approved March sixth (6th), A. D. one thousand eight hundred and

eighty-three (1883), be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. That the sum of four hundred (400) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury belonging to the internal improvement fund, or the first (1st) money that shall come into the treasury belonging to said fund, not already appropriated, to aid in building a substantial bridge across Spunk Brook, so called, at the highway crossing thereof hereinafter mentioned.

SEC. 2. That section two (2) of said chapter be amended so as to

read as follows:

Sec. 2. That said bridge shall be built under the direction of the commissioners hereinafter named, at the crossing of said stream by the public highway now located and established upon the line dividing Stearns and Morrison counties, and no part of such appropriation shall be paid out of said treasury until such bridge is completed and ready for travel.

SEC. 3. That section three (3) of said chapter be amended so as to

read as follows:

Sec. 3. That John Schulteis, George W. Henley and James G. Demerritt, are hereby appointed commissioners on the part of the state to superintend the construction of said bridge, to examine all contracts and approve all vouchers in relation thereto. Said commissioners shall report the cost of said bridge, when completed and ready for travel, to the state auditor, and thereupon said auditor shall draw his order in favor of the treasurer of said Stearns county, on the state treasurer for money belonging to the proper fund, to the amount of the cost of said bridge as reported by said commissioners, not exceeding four hundred (400) dollars, and, on presentation of said order, the state treasurer shall pay over such money to said county treasurer, who shall disburse the same upon the order of said commissioners, any two of whom may act in the premises.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

passage.
