CHAPTER 162.

AN ACT CEDING JURISDICTION TO THE UNITED STATES OVER CERTAIN LANDS DONATED TO THE UNITED STATES FOR A FISH HATCHERY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota;

Juriediction ceded.

SECTION 1. That jurisdiction is hereby ceded to the United States over so much land as may be appurtenet and necessary to the construction of a fish hatchery by the United States and the maintenance thereof at the mouth of Lester river near Duluth in the state of Minnesota, not to exceed ten acres, five acres of which have been heretofore donated to the United States for said purpose.

Map to be made.

SEC. 2. The secretary of state shall, within one (1) month after the title to said land is vested in the United States, cause a map of the same to be made showing definitely the boundaries thereof and shall file the same in his office and make a proper record thereof.

Reservation of ceded rights.

SEC. 3. From the cession of jurisdiction to the United States, hereby granted, the following reservation is hereby made, to-wit: The state of Minnesota shall have and hereby does reserve and retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States in and over the territory aforesaid so far as may be necessary for said state and its officers to serve any process or papers, civil or criminal, that may be lawfully issued under the authority of said state or of any of the departments of the government thereof, and to arrest on said territory and punish any person or persons charged with crime against the laws of said state whether committed within or without the boundaries of said territory in the same manner and to the same extent as though said cession of jurisdiction had not been made.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
