CHAPTER 209.

AN ACT TO REIMBURSE MATTHEW GROSS FOR EXPENSES INCURRED IN A CONTESTED ELECTION.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Reimburses Matthew Gross Section 1. That the sum of seven hundred and fifty (750) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to Matthew Gross out of any moneys in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse him for moneys expended in the contested election case of Samuel P. Snider against Matthew Gross, for a seat in the house of representatives for the term commencing January first (1), A. D., one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887).

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 210.

AN ACT TO PAY ARREARS OF SALARY TO THE SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF IMMIGRATION, AND REPAY MONEYS EXPENDED BY HIM ON ACCOUNT OF THAT OFFICE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Arrears of salary to secretary board of immigration.

When act to

take effect.

Section 1. That the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars (\$650) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pay to H. H. Young six and one-half $(6\frac{1}{2})$ months salary, for services as secretary of the board of immigration, from June sixteenth (16th), to December thirty-first (31st), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six (1886), inclusive.

SEC. 2. That the sum of five hundred and four dollars and seventy-five cents (\$504.75) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to repay H. H. Young, secretary of the board of immigration, moneys advanced by him to meet

expenses of that office.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
