## CHAPTER 229.

[H. F. No, 62.]

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PRINTING OF SCHOOL LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota. '

Hevision of school laws. Section I. That the superintendent of public instruction is hereby required to prepare a separate edition of the school laws of this state, to include all additions and amendments of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887), to which he shall add such explanations, opinions of the attorney general and decisions of the supreme court as are necessary for the full understanding and interpretation of the same, and all of which he shall submit to the attorney general for his approval.

Secretary of state to have same printed.

SEC. 2. The secretary of state is hereby ordered, upon the requisition of the superintendent of public instruction, to cause to be printed eight thousand (8,000) copies of the school laws for the use of the department of public instruction; and the superintendent of public instruction is directed to deliver to the county superintendents of schools one (1) copy each for themselves, and one (1) copy for each of the clerks of boards of education and of trustees of their respective counties.

Appropriation.

SEC. 3. The sum of three hundred (300) dollars, subject to the order of the superintendent of public instruction to defray any necessary expenses in the preparation of the matter for printing is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.
