

the use of the grounds for celebrations and other public exercises, but not for any private purposes; *provided*, that none of such public exercises shall in any way conflict with the annual exhibition of the Dakota county agricultural society.

SEC. 3. This act shall be submitted to the legal voters of said village for their ratification or rejection, at the next regular village election to be held after the passage of this act.

Those voting in favor of its ratification shall have written or printed, or partly written and partly printed upon their ballots the words "In favor of appropriating money for fair grounds", and those voting against such ratification shall have written or printed, or partly written and partly printed upon their ballots the words "Against appropriating money for fair grounds". And if a majority of those voting upon the subject shall vote in favor of such ratification then the trustees shall have full power to act as provided in the previous section of this act, but if a majority shall vote against such proposition then this act shall be null and void.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 368.

[H. F. No. 763.]

AN ACT FOR COMPENSATION TO THE JUDGES OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF THE FOURTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT, AND TO REPEAL SPECIAL LAW APPROVED FEBRUARY TWENTY-FOURTH (24TH), ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE (1885).

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That there shall be paid annually by the county commissioners of Hennepin county out of the county funds, to the judges of the district court of the fourth judicial district, in addition to the salaries allowed them by the general laws of the state of Minnesota, the sum of one thousand (1,000) dollars each, payable quarterly.

SEC. 2. That the special act of the legislature entitled "An act for compensation to the judges of the district court of the fourth judicial district," approved February twenty-fourth (24th), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five (1885), is hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
