

CHAPTER 108.

[H. F. No. 8.]

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION FIFTEEN (15) OF CHAPTER THREE (3), OF GENERAL STATUTES ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), RELATING TO COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section fifteen (15) of chapter three (3) of general statutes one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 15. The compensation of members of the legislature, at every regular and extra session, shall be computed by including the first and last days of the session and every intervening day."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 109.

AN ACT AMENDING SECTION TWO (2) OF CHAPTER SEVENTY-SEVEN (77) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), RELATING TO ACTIONS BY OR AGAINST EXECUTORS, ADMINISTRATORS AND HEIRS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section two (2) of chapter seventy-seven (77) of the general statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878) be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Personal
representatives
of deceased
may maintain
action in
certain cases.

When death is caused by the wrongful act or omission of any party or corporation the personal representatives of the deceased may maintain an action, if he might have maintained an action had he lived, for an injury caused by the same act or omission, by which the death was caused; but the action shall be commenced within two 2) years after the act or omission by which the death was caused. The damages thereon cannot exceed ten

exceed \$10,000.

thousand dollars (\$10,000), and the amount recovered is to be for the exclusive benefit of the widow and next of kin, to be distributed to them in the same proportions as the personal property of the deceased person.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS ONE (1), SIX (6), TWELVE (12), NINETEEN (19), TWENTY-TWO (22), FORTY-THREE (43) AND FIFTY-SEVEN (57) OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND SEVEN (107) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), AS AMENDED BY AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS ONE (1), SIX (6), TWELVE (12), NINETEEN (19), TWENTY-TWO (22), FORTY-THREE (43) AND FIFTY-SEVEN (57) OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND SEVEN (107) OF GENERAL STATUTES ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), RELATING TO GRAND JURIES AND REPEALING ALL LAWS INCONSISTENT THEREWITH." APPROVED MARCH TWENTY-SECOND (22nd), ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE (1889), RELATING TO GRAND JURIES AND REPEALING ALL LAWS INCONSISTENT THEREWITH.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter one hundred and seven (107) of the general statutes one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878) as amended by an act entitled "an act to amend sections one (1), six (6), twelve (12), nineteen (19), twenty-two (22), forty-three (43) and fifty-seven (57) of chapter one hundred and seven (107) of general statutes one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878), relating to grand juries, and repealing all laws inconsistent therewith," approved March twenty-second (22nd), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. A grand jury is a body of men not less than thirteen (13) nor more than fifteen (15) in number returned at stated periods from the citizens of the county before a court of competent jurisdiction, chosen by lot and
