AN ACT TO CHANGE THE TERM OF DISTRICT COURT IN MILLE LACS COUNTY, MINN.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

District court Mille Lacs county, terms of.

Writs, processes, etc., when returnable. SECTION 1. That the general term of the district court in the county of Mille Lacs, state of Minnesota, shall be held on the first (1st) Monday in September in each year. SEC. 2. That all writs, proofs, bonds, recognizances, continuances, appeals, notices, and proceedings had, issued, or returnable to the term of court in and for said county, as fixed by law prior to the passage of this act, shall be deemed and construed as made, taken and returnable to the proper term of courts in said county, as fixed by this act.

SEC. 3. That all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE (133) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUS-AND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE (1885), RELAT-ING TO THE GENERAL TERMS OF THE DISTRICT COURT OF POPE COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

District court Pope county, terms of. SECTION 1. That section one (1), of chapter one hundred and thirty-three (133), of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five (1885), be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. That the general terms of the district court in and for the county of Pope in the seventh (7th) judicial district shall be held on the first(1st) Tuesday in April and the the third (3d) Tuesday in October of each year; but no grand jury shall be summoned for the April term in said county, unless the judge of said district shall make and file with the clerk of court, for said county, at least fifteen (15) days before such term, an order directing the summoning of such grand jury.
