

CHAPTER 279.

AN ACT TO REIMBURSE "I" COMPANY, SECOND REGIMENT, M. N. G., IN THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED (500) DOLLARS, FOR PROPERTY DESTROYED BY FIRE.

WHEREAS, At the city of St. Peter, Minnesota, on the 12th day of November, 1887, a fire occurred which destroyed personal property of the value of five hundred (500) dollars, belonging to "I" company, 2d regiment, M. N. G., upon which there was no insurance, and,

WHEREAS, Said company is unable, and ought not to bear the loss of such property; *Therefore,*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of five hundred (500) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the treasury of the state of Minnesota, and out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse said "I" company for such loss, and the state auditor is hereby instructed to draw his warrant upon the state treasurer for said amount, and deliver the same to the captain of said company, and the state treasurer is hereby directed to pay the same as aforesaid. To reimburse
"I" company.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. When act to
take effect.

AN ACT TO COMMEMORATE THE BATTLES OF NEW ULM, AND APPROPRIATING MONEY TO ERECT A MONUMENT FOR THAT PURPOSE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Whereas the battles of New Ulm, fought between the nineteenth (19th) and twenty-fourth (24th) days of August, eighteen hundred and sixty-two (1862), were instrumental in checking an invasion of the Sioux Indians into the heart of the state of Minnesota, and,
