CHAPTER 49.

[H. F. No. 1017.]

AN ACT RELATING TO THE CHALLENGING OF GRAND JURORS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. In any action or proceeding, when either party challenges a juror on the ground that he is not a citizen of the United States, the sworn testimony of the juror so challenged, or a duly authenticated copy of his certificate of naturalization, offered in evidence, shall be prima facie evidence of such person's qualification in such respect; and the burden of proving such alleged disqualification shall be incumbent upon the party to the action or proceeding interposing the challenge.

CHAPTER 50.

[H. F. No. 88.]

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT CLERKS OF DISTRICT COURTS PRACTICING AS ATTORNEYS IN THE COURTS OF WHICH THEY ARE CLERKS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. No person holding the office of, or acting as clerk of any district court in this state, shall be allowed to

practice as attorney, or solicitor, in the court in which he holds the office of clerk of court, or is acting as clerk of court. *Provided*, that any person now holding such office of a clerk of a district court shall be excepted from the operation and effect of this act while serving out the remainder of his present term of office, and no longer.

CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT TO EXEMPT SENATORS, REPRESENTATIVES, CLERKS AND OTHER EMPLOYES OF THE LEGISLATURE FROM JURY DUTY DURING THE SESSIONS THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Senators, representatives, clerks and all other employes of the legislature of the state of Minnesota shall be exempt from jury duty during the sessions thereof.

CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER EIGHTY-TWO (82) OF THE GENERAL STATUTES OF EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), BEING AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT IN RELATION TO THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF FRUIT CULTURE IN THIS STATE."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter eighty-two (82) of the general laws of eighteen hundred seventy-eight (1878), entitled "an act in relation to the encouragement of fruit culture in this state," be and hereby is repealed.
