

SEC. 2. That the village council of said village shall make provisions by levying of taxes for the payment of said bonds and interest as they shall mature.

SEC. 3. No such bonds shall be issued by the said village council under the provisions of this act until such issue shall have been authorized by a majority of the legal voters of said village present and voting at any annual or special election of said village. Notice of said election shall be given in the same manner as by law required for special elections of said village. At such election all persons voting in favor of the issuance of such bonds shall have printed or written or partly printed and partly written on their ballots the words, "In favor of bonds." Those voting against issuance of such bonds the words, "Against issuing bonds." Such votes shall be canvassed and returned in the same manner prescribed by law for the canvassing and returning of the votes cast for village officers, and if at said election a majority of the legal voters voting on said question shall vote "In favor of bonds," then said bonds may be issued in accordance with the provisions of this act.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 176.

[H. F. No. 1111.]

AN ACT ENTITLED AN ACT TO VEST IN THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF RAMSEY, AND IN THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF VILLAGES WITHIN SAID COUNTY, EXTENDED POWERS FOR THE GRANTING OF FRANCHISES OR LICENSES TO PERSONS OR CORPORATIONS FOR PUTTING IN AND OPERATING ELECTRIC AND STEAM MOTORS AND RAILWAYS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the county commissioners of the county of Ramsey, shall in addition to the powers now vested in them, be authorized and are hereby authorized to grant to any person or persons, corporation or corporations the power upon such terms as they shall deem and consider advisable and proper, and for a period of not more than thirty years from the time of granting such power the use of the streets, roads, alleys and highways in the said county of Ramsey and outside of the corporate limits of the city of St. Paul, for the purposes of any railway using as motive power, electricity, steam or horses.

SEC. 2. The village council of villages within said county shall have and may exercise similar powers to those vested in the county commissioners as provided in section one (1) of this act.

SEC. 3. That the said county commissioners and the said village councils respectively may grant such franchises or licenses upon application therefor, at any of their meetings, and upon such notices as they may direct respectively, and by a vote of twothirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) of said commissioners and village councils.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 177.

[H. F. No. 302.]

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SLAYTON, IN THE COUNTY OF MURRAY, IN THIS STATE, TO ISSUE BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING CEMETERY GROUNDS, AND ENCLOSING, LAYING OUT AND ORNAMENTING THE SAME.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. The village council of the village of Slayton, in the county of Murray, in this state, is hereby authorized to issue the bonds of said village to an amount not exceeding one thousand (\$1,000) dollars, for the purpose of purchasing cemetery grounds, and inclosing, laying out and ornamenting the same.

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall be made payable not less than five (5) nor more than twenty (20) years from the date thereof, and shall have annual interest coupons attached, providing for the annual payment of interest not exceeding the rate of eight (8) per cent, per annum, and shall not be disposed of at less than par.

SEC. 3. The village council of said village shall make provision by the levying of taxes for the payment of said bonds and interest as they shall mature.

SEC. 4. That no bonds shall be issued by the said village council under the provisions of this act, unless the issue thereof shall have been approved by a vote of a majority of the qualified electors of said village, who shall vote upon the proposition at the annual election held in village for the election of village officers in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889). The voters in favor of issuing said bonds, shall vote a ballot having thereon the words, "Issue of bonds for cemetery purposes,—Yes"; the voters opposed thereto, shall vote a ballot having thereon the words, "Issue of bonds for cemetery purposes,—No." Said votes shall be counted, canvassed, and returned in the same manner as the votes for village officers at the same election.

The votes on said proposition shall be on separate ballots.
