

**CHAPTER 355.**

[H. F. No. 1215.]

AN ACT TO MAKE THE OFFICE OF ABSTRACT CLERK OF RAMSEY COUNTY ELECTIVE BY THE PEOPLE AND TO FIX THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE PRESENT CLERK.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That at the general election for the county of Ramsey in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two (1892), and every two (2) years thereafter, there shall be elected by the qualified electors of Ramsey county, in the same manner that other county officers are elected, an abstract clerk of said Ramsey county, whose duties shall be those now prescribed and such as may hereafter be prescribed by law. His term of office shall be two (2) years and until his successor is elected and qualified and shall commence on the first Monday in January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three (1893.)

SEC. 2. The term of office of the present abstract clerk of Ramsey county shall continue until the first Monday in January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three (1893), and until his successor is elected and qualified.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

**CHAPTER 356.**

[H. F. No. 1277.]

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES OF A BOARD OF LEVEE COMMISSIONERS FOR THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :*

SECTION 1. That A. G. Wedge, D. D. Merrill and R. W. Ransom be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to examine into the condition in all respects of the west Saint Paul levee (so called) in the city of Saint Paul, and to devise and report to the present session of the legislature of the state of Minnesota, if possible, and if not then to the next session of said legislature, a plan and scheme for the completion of said levee or such part thereof as in their judgment may be for the best interests of all persons concerned; and to further report a plan, if in their judgment the same can reasonably be de-
