

CHAPTER 410.

[S. F. No. 239.]

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF THE POOR IN CERTAIN CASES IN CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Whenever application is made by a petition of five (5) freeholders and the taxpayers of Carver county, in writing, to any county commissioner of Carver county, that a person, then a resident of said county though having no legal residence in said county or state is in need of public support, or medical and surgical aid, it shall be the duty of the commissioners to whom said application shall be made, to immediately investigate the matter of such application, and if such commissioner shall determine that the relief aforesaid is necessary, he shall cause suitable relief to be provided for such poor person, and the expenses for the public support and the medical and surgical aid, shall be paid by said county, upon their allowance by the county commissioners or the reasonable charges therefor.

SEC. 2. That such charges and expenses as have already been made and incurred as are deemed reasonable by said commissioners and are now pending before said commissioners for allowance in cases where public support and medical and surgical aid shall have been furnished to poor persons not residents of the state of Minnesota, may be allowed by said commissioners, and thereupon such allowances shall be paid by said county from the treasury thereof.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 411.

AN ACT TO FIX THE COMPENSATION, SALARY AND CLERK HIRE OF THE COUNTY AUDITOR AND JUDGE OF PROBATE IN THE COUNTY OF FILLMORE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The annual salary of the county auditor of the county of Fillmore shall be two thousand (2,000) dollars, including all clerk hire.

SEC. 2. The annual salary of the judge of probate of the county of Fillmore shall be twelve hundred (1200) dollars, including all clerk hire.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after January first (1st), eighteen hundred and ninety-one (1891).
