

patient, and has thereby become permanently disabled, so that she has entirely lost the use of her arm and hand; therefore:

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of fifteen hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the treasury of the state of Minnesota and out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated to reimburse said Margaret Vogel for such loss, and the state auditor is hereby instructed to draw his warrant upon the state treasurer for said amount and deliver the same to said Margaret Vogel, and the state treasurer is hereby directed to pay the same as aforesaid.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 238.

H. F. No. 260.

An act for the relief of G. M. Hillman and to appropriate money therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of five thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for the relief of G. M. Hillman for personal injuries sustained by him while in the performance of his duties as a member of the national guard of the state of Minnesota, by reason of the premature explosion of a cannon, whereby he was injured and incapacitated from labor for life.

CHAPTER 239.

H. F. No. 357.

An act to appropriate money for additional clerk hire in the office of the state treasurer.

Appropriation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The sum of nine hundred dollars is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for additional clerk hire in the office of the state treasurer for the fiscal year ending July 31st, 1893, and annually thereafter.
