SEC. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act by pursuing, hunting or killing any game bird or animal shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty (50) dollars nor more than one hundred (100) dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days or over ninety (90) days for each offense. Penalty.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 208.

S. F. No. 629.

An act to legalize conveyances made by husband and wife by separate deeds of the same real estate. Separate deeds by husband and wife.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That in all cases where a married man has heretofore conveyed real estate belonging to him, by deed legally witnessed, sealed and acknowledged, but not signed by his wife, and his wife has afterward conveyed the same real estate by deed legally witnessed, sealed and acknowledged, but not signed by her husband, to the grantee named in the husband's deed or to his grantees, the conveyance shall be as valid and effectual to pass the title to such grantee as if the conveyance had been made by a single instrument executed by husband and wife. Healing act.

SEC. 2. The provisions of this act shall not effect any action now pending in any court in this state.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
