

## CHAPTER 22.

*An act to amend section two (2) of chapter twenty-seven (27), general statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878), relating to the publication of the decisions of the Supreme Court.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section two (2) of chapter twenty-seven (27) of the general statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878) be, and the same is, hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section two (2) Powers and duties.—The reporter shall make careful and accurate reports of all cases argued and decided by the supreme court. He shall be entitled to the possession of the original files in all cases for a reasonable time to prepare copies for publication, and shall report the cases more or less at large, according to their relative importance. The report of each case shall contain concise notes of the points decided, a statement of the facts taken from the records, when the same are not fully given in the opinion of the court, the names of the counsel with the points made and authorities cited, (more or less at length in the discretion of the reporter), and the opinion of the court. He shall publish a volume of such reports as often as there is sufficient matter to form a volume of not less than six hundred (600) pages. All volumes hereafter published shall bear the uniform title of "Minnesota Reports;" *provided*, that when a decision only involves a principle well settled by previous decisions, the supreme court shall note, or cause to be noted, on the opinion that it is not to be reported in full, and shall refer to the last fully reported case covering the same point or points, and the report of such cases shall contain only the title and syllabi which shall be published in each volume under the head of "Cases not reported in full."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
