JOINT RESOLUTION.

Freight rates.

A joint resolution of the senate and the house of representatives authorizing the appointment of a committee consisting of three (3) members of the house of representatives and two members of the senate, to confer with a similar committee appointed by the legislative assembly of the state of North Dakota to propose suitable legislation for the purpose of securing lower freight rates upon grain and coal.

Conference committee with North Dakota. Be it resolved by the senate of the state of Minnesota, the house of representatives concurring, that a committee consisting of three (3) members of the house of representatives and two members of the senate be appointed to confer with a similar committee already appointed by the legislative assembly of the state of North Dakota, with a view of proposing suitable legislation for the purpose of securing lower freight rates upon grain and coal.
