and construed as made, taken and returnable to the

proper term of court as fixed by this act.

SEC. 4. All acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed; and this one shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 378.

Batablishing 17th judicial dist.

An act for the establishment of a new judicial district to be known as the "Seventeenth (17th) judicial district," and to fix dates for holding court therein.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the counties of Faribault and Martin be and the same are hereby detached from the Sixth (6th) judicial district, and that the county of Jackson be and the same is hereby detached from the Thirteenth judicial district; and said counties of Faribault, Martin and Jackson, so detached, are hereby created into a judicial district, to be known and designated as the "Seventeenth (17th) judicial district of Minnesota."

SEC. 2. The terms of courts in said new district to

be held as follows:

In Faribault county, on the first (1st) Tuesday in June, and the second (2nd) Tuesday in January of each year.

In Martin county, the first (1st) Tuesday in May and

December of each year.

In Jackson county, the second Tuesday in April, and

the first Wednesday in November of each year.

SEC. 3. A district judge shall be elected therefor, at the next general election, and the governor is hereby authorized to appoint a district judge for said district, to serve until his successor shall be elected.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.
