CHAPTER 134.

Judges of
district
courts,
salaries of.

An act fixing the salaries of the judges of the district court of the State of Minnesota.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Fixed at
\$3,500;
counties
empowered to
increase it
to \$5,000.

SECTION 1. The judges of the district court shall each receive a salary of three thousand five hundred (3,500) dollars per annum, *provided*, that whenever any county shall have a population of one hundred thousand (100,000) or more there shall be paid annually by each said county, out of the county funds, to each of the judges of the district court of such county, the sum of fifteen hundred (1,500) dollars, payable quarterly, in addition to said sum of three thousand five hundred (3,500) dollars.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 135.

Freight line
and equip-
ment com-
panies, taxa-
tion of.

An act to amend chapter one hundred and sixty (160) of the general laws of 1897, relating to the taxation of freight line and equipment companies.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section five (5) of chapter one hundred and sixty (160) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-seven (1897), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 5. The state board of appraisers and assessors shall, on or before the first Monday in October report to
