SEC. 2. That section two (2) of title nine (9) of chapter one hundred and three (103), General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven (1897), be amended so as to read as follows:

Money, how
paid and dis-
tributed.

The sum of money above appropriated shall be paid to the county treasurer of said county on the warrant of the state auditor, who shall issue such vouchers to said treasurer on his receiving the certificate of the chairman of the board of county commissioners of said county, showing that the sum of money herein appropriated has been expended as provided and in pursuance of the provisions of this act.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 89.

H. F. No. 111.

County treasurers; clerk hire.

An act to provide for clerk hire of county treasurers in counties where the treasurer's salary is fixed by special law, and no provision is made for an annual clerk hire.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

County commissioners empowered to furnish it in certain counties.

SECTION 1. In all counties where the salary of the county treasurer is fixed by special law and no provision is made for annual clerk hire, by said special law, the county commissioners of such counties are hereby authorized and empowered to furnish such treasurer, in their discretion, with necessary assistance or clerk hire not to exceed eight hundred (\$800) dollars per annum.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
