All act legalizing school bonds heretofore voted upon by cities ander the provisions of chapter two hitndred and four (204) of the Gencral Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetythree ( 1893 ) and acts amendatory thereof.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section i. That all school bonds heretofore voted upon by any city under or pursuant to the provisions of chapter two hundred and four (204) of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota, for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three (1893), as amended by chapter one hundred and twenty-eight (128) of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five (1895) and other acts amendatory thereof, are hereby declared to be, when issued and sold, legal and binding obligations of said city; providing that the proposition to issue said bonds received a two-thirds majority of all votes cast upon the proposition to issue said bonds at the election when said proposition was voted upon; and providcd further, that all other requirements of law have been fully complied with.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
