Peremptory challenges.

An act to amend section 14 in chapter 116 of the Gencral Statutes of Minnesota for 1878, the same being section 7364 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for 1894, relating to peremptory challenges.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION I. That section 14 in chapter 116 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for 1878, the same being section 7364 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for 1894, be and is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 14. If the offense charged is punishable with death, or with imprisonment in the state prison for life, the state is entitled to ten peremptory challenges and the defendant to twenty peremptory challenges. On a trial for any other offense, the state is entitled to three peremptory challenges and the defendant to five peremptory challenges.

Sec. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent inerewith are hereby expressly repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
