CHAPTER 200.

H. F. No. 413.

An act to amend section one (I) of chapter three hundred and forty-one (341), General Laws, Minnesota, ents of (1901), relating to the allowance of expenses of county superintendents of schools.

County schools.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That section one (1) of chapter three hundred and forty-one (341), General Laws, Minnesota, 1901, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section I. That in all counties in this state where In counties of 75,000 the salary of the county superintendent of schools does to 10,000 not exceed the sum of eighteen hundred (1,800) dollars per annum, and the population of said county be not less than seventy-five thousand (75,000) nor more than one hundred and fifty thousand (150,000), the board of county commissioners shall allow such superintendent a reasonable sum for traveling expenses, and expense of keeping of one team, but the expenses so allowed shall certain exnot, in the aggregate, exceed the sum of two hundred and fifty (\$250) dollars in any year. The provisions of this act shall apply to counties where the compensation of the superintendent is fixed by special act as well as when the same is established by general law.

CHAPTER 201.

An act to provide for the disposition of money received from liquor licenses in townships outside of the limits of incorporated cities and villages.

Section 1. All moneys received from licenses issued by the board of county commissioners to sell intoxicating liquors in any township of this state, outside of the incor-
