## CHAPTER 265.

An act relating to the cancellation of license for the sale of intoxicating liquors and providing for the refunding of the unearned portion of such license in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION I. That the officers of any county, village or municipality within the State of Minnesota having authority to grant license for the sale of intoxicating liquors may, in case of the death of any licensee, where its officers issuing such license deem it just and to the best interests of such county, village or municipality, refund to the legal representatives of such licensee an amount not exceeding such proportion of the amount paid for such license as the unexpired term bears to the term for which such license was granted.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 266.

An act to assess a tax to raise funds and to appropriate the same for buildings and other equipment for the department of agriculture of the University of Minnesota.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION I. The state auditor is hereby authorized and directed to levy for the years 1903 and 1904 such fraction of a mill tax on all the taxable property of the state as will produce in the aggregate \$250,000, said tax to be levied and collected as other state taxes are levied and collected, the proceeds of said tax levy to be used through such agency as provided by law in further equipping the department of agriculture of said university as follows:

For the construction and equipment of a main building to be used by the agricultural department for instruction and experiment work; for the entomological and sewing departments; executive offices; rooms for the
