### CHAPTER 30.

S. F. No. 178.

*An act to amend section one (1) of chapter one hundred thirty-four (134) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1899, as amended by section one (1) of chapter sixty-seven (67), General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1902, relating to salaries of district judges.*

Salaries of district judges.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section one (1) of chapter one hundred thirty-four (134) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1899, as amended by section one (1) of chapter sixty-seven (67) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1902, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The judges of the district court shall each receive a salary of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) per annum;

*Provided,* That when any county shall have a population of seventy-five thousand (75,000) or more, there shall be paid annually by each said county out of the county funds to each of the said judges of the district court of such county the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) in addition to the said sum of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500); and all salaries and compensation of the judges of the district court of this state shall be payable monthly; subject, however, to the provisions of chapter forty-seven (47) of the General Laws of this state for the year 1901.

In counties of 75,000 and over \$1,500 additional.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
