CHAPTER 400.

Legalizing
certain
publications.

An act entitled "An act to legalize and make valid certain publications required or authorized by law to be made in a newspaper, and the records thereof."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That in all cases where any general law, probate notice, or other notice required or authorized by law to be published in a newspaper, has been heretofore published the number of times required by law in a newspaper which, during the period of such publication and during the period of one year prior to the commencement thereof, conformed in all respects to the definition of a newspaper contained in section 1, chapter 33, of the Laws of 1893 of Minnesota, and amendments thereto, except as to the number of paying subscribers required by law, all such publications and the records thereof are hereby legalized and made valid and effectual for all purposes. *provided*, that at the time of such publication there was on file in the office of the auditor of the county in which said newspaper was published an affidavit conforming to the provisions of section 2 of said chapter 33 of said Laws of 1893, and amendments thereto.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 401.

An act to permit the use of fish houses within this state.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Permitting
the use of
fish houses
by obtaining
permit.

SECTION 1. That on all inland lakes of this state a fish house may be used for the purpose of taking pickerel, suckers and red horse from the fifteenth day of December to the first day of April of each year, *provided* that any person desiring to use such fish house shall first make application for a permit for such use to and obtain such permit from the board of game and fish commissioners of this state, stating that the same is to be used by him for the purpose of obtaining fish for his domestic use and
