CHAPTER 55.

An act to fix the salary of the attorney general.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION I. That the salary of the attorney general Salary of for the year nineteen hundred and three (1903), begin- general. ning in the month of January thereof, and annually thereafter, shall be forty-eight hundred (\$4,800) dollars, which sum shall be in lieu of all other compensation now provided by law.

SEC. 2. That subdivision six (6) of section five hundred and thirty (530) of the General Statutes of eighteen hundred and ninety-four (1894), be and the same is hereby amended by striking out the words "thirty-five hundred (3,500,)" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "forty-eight hundred (4,800)."

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 56.

An act to amend section one hundred and forty-three (143) of chapter forty-six (46) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889), being an act to establish a probate code, and relating to the service of notice upon persons proposed to be put under guardianship by reason of incompetency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION I. That section one hundred and forty-three (143) of chapter forty-six (46) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (1889), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 143. Upon the presentation of such application or petition, the probate court shall fix the time and place for the hearing of the same, and shall cause notice be given. of such hearing, and of the time and place thereof, to be given to the person proposed to be put under guardianship, at least fourteen (14) days prior to the time fixed for such hearing; and if such person is an inmate of a
