#### CHAPTER 74.

H. F. No. 121.

*An act authorizing appropriations by boards of county commissioners in counties now or hereafter having a population of one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants or more, for public improvements in, or about navigable lakes.*

Cities of 150,000 or more.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That wherever there exists, in any organized county in the State of Minnesota now or hereafter having a population of one hundred and fifty thousand (150,000) inhabitants or more, a navigable lake, or lakes, which is, or are, wholly or for the greater part thereof within the territory or limits of such county (and which is, or are, not, either wholly or in part, within the corporate limits of any city in such county), the board of county commissioners of said county is hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate, each year, from the revenue fund of such county, such sums for public improvements on, in or about said lake or lakes as, in the opinion of said board may be necessary.

Commissioners authorized to appropriate money for improvement of navigable lakes.

*Provided*, That the total amount of said sum or sums so appropriated during the years one thousand nine hundred and three, one thousand nine hundred and four, one thousand nine hundred and five, shall not exceed the sum of ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars, in either of said years, and that the total amount of said sum or sums so appropriated shall not exceed the sum of five thousand (\$5,000) dollars in any year thereafter. *Provided, further*, that the question of population shall be determined by the official census next preceding any appropriation made under the provision of this act.

Not to exceed \$10,000 in any one year.

SEC. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
