SEC. 3. That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 410.

S. F. No. 21.

A bill for an act to provide additional means for completing and furnishing the court house and city hall building in the city of Minneapolis, and to authorize the issue and sale of bonds therefor.

Provides for funds for completing court house of Hennepin county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of providing further money for completing and furnishing the court house and city hall building in course of erection upon block seventy-seven (77) in the plat of the original town of Minneapolis, the board of court house and city hall commissioners, created and existing under and by virtue of chapter three hundred and ninety-five (395) of the Special Laws of 1887 as supplemented and amended by chapter sixty-two (62) of the Special Laws of 1889, is hereby authorized to issue and sell additional "Hennepin and Minneapolis Court House and City Hall bonds" to an amount not exceeding two hundred fifty thousand (\$250,000) dollars in par value, which bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding 4 per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, and shall not be sold for less than par.

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall be designated "city series," shall be signed by the president and secretary of said board and counter-signed by the city comptroller of the city of Minneapolis, shall be dated March 2, 1903, and shall be for one thousand (1000) dollars each and be made payable as follows, to-wit: twelve thousand five hundred (\$12,500.00) dollars on January 1st, 1914, and the same amount on the first day of January of the years 1915 to 1933 both inclusive. They shall become and be a charge against the city of Minneapolis, and the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon shall be provided for by the city council of said city.

Bonds designated "city series."

Said county shall levy an annual tax of not more than one-fourth of a mill on the dollar upon all taxable property subject to general taxation within said city of Minneapolis until the money derived from such tax levy shall be sufficient to pay and discharge all of said bonds and all interest accruing thereon.

SEC. 3. The money received from the sale of said bonds shall be deposited by the treasurer of said board of court house and city hall commissioners according to the directions of said board, and all interest or income accruing from such deposits shall be accounted for to the board and be by it applied to the prosecution of the work for which said board was created.

SEC. 4. The proceeds of the sale of said bonds shall be used by said board for completing said court house and city hall building, or so much thereof as may be necessary for public use, and for furnishing the part so completed.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 411.

Relating
to salary
of register
of deeds

A bill for an act to repeal chapter three hundred ninety-three (393) of the Special Laws of 1887, relating to salary of county register of deeds in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That chapter three hundred ninety-three (393) of the Special Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887) be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
