## CHAPTER 12-S. F. No. 257.

An Act to give the regents of the University of Minnesota authority to deed not more than an acre of land of the University farm in Ramsey County, Minnesota, in section 21, township 29, range 23 west, to the United States government for the purpose of erecting a building for the weather bureau, or for other agricultural purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Regents authorized to deed land.—Section 1. The regents of the University of Minnesota through its executive officers are hereby given authority to deed not more than one acre of land of the university farm at St. Anthony Park, Ramsey County, Minnesota, in section 21, township 29, range 23 west, to the United States government for the purposes of the weather bureau of the United States department of agriculture.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 13—H. F. No. 345.

An Act to appropriate money for the contingent expenses of the attorney general's office and to provide additional assistance for the attorney general when necessary.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Appropriating \$50,000 for attorney general.—Section 1. For the purpose of defraying the contingent expenses of the attorney general's office, including the payment of reasonable compensation to such additional counsel as the attorney general may from time to time find it necessary to employ to assist him in handling the legal business of the state promptly and efficiently, there is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars to be available at once, and the further sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be available January 1st, 1908, to be used for the above purposes such

money to be paid out only upon verified voucher, approved in writing by the attorney general.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 14--H. F. No. 120.

An Act to repeal sections 2486, 2487 and 2488 of the Revised Laws, 1905, relating to permits to prospect for iron ore upon lands belonging to the state.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Law relating to permits and prospect for iron ore repealed.—Section 1. That sections two thousand four hundred and eighty-six (2486), two thousand four hundred and eighty-seven (2487) and two thousand four hundred and eighty-eight (2488) of the Revised Laws of 1905, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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## CHAPTER 15-H. F. No. 456.

An Act to validate and legalize payments of public moneys heretofore made by officers of cities having over 50,000 inhabitants to refund fees paid for liquor licenses to persons whose licenses have been revoked.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Fees paid for liquor licenses refunded.—Section 1. That in all cases where the officers of any city in this state having a population of over 50,000 inhabitants, have heretofore in good faith paid out public moneys to any person, whose license to sell intoxicating liquors in such city has been revoked, or to his assigns, for the purpose of refunding to such person, or his assigns, any portion of the fee paid for such license, such payments are hereby in all respects validated and legalized.
