CHAPTER 258—H. F. No. 527.

An Act entitled an act to amend section 1771, Revised Laws, 1905, prohibiting the manufacture and sale, for use as food, of certain articles and substances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Coal tar dye or saccharin prohibited.—Section 1. That section 1771, Revised Laws, 1905, be amended to read as follows:

Applicable to all Foods-The manufacture or sale of any article, designed or offered for sale or use as food, is prohibited, if it contain or is mixed with, or by use of any substance or preparation the manufacture or sale of which is specifically prohibited by any section of this chapter; or if it be in itself injurious, or if it contain any ingredient injurious to health; or if it contains coal-tar dye or saccharin; or if it consist in whole or in part of a filthy or decomposed substance, or of any portion of any animal unfit for food, or of the product of a diseased animal, or one that has died otherwise than by slaughter. And it shall be unlawful to add or apply to any article designed for sale or use as food, any preservative which conceals or tends to conceal the taste, odor, or other evidence of putrefaction, taint or filth existing in such article, or which conceals or tends to conceal inferiority in any form.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 259—H. F. No. 702.

An Act to amend section 1901 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota, 1905, relating to insurance of state buildings—fuel—and providing annual appropriation for the payment of premiums on such insurance.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Appropriation for payment of insurance premiums.—Section 1. That section 1901 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota,
