

CHAPTER 37—S. F. No. 108.

An Act authorizing counties to pay over to town, village or city treasurers, certain sums of money from the county poor fund, upon change from the county system to the town system of caring for the poor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Money to be paid to town treasurers.—Section 1. That whenever the system for relief of the poor in any county is changed from the county system to the town system and there has been levied or assessed for the year in which such change occurs, a tax for the poor fund of such county under such county system, 80 per cent of the moneys received by such county for such tax shall be paid over to the treasurers of the various towns, villages and cities of such county in the manner hereinafter provided.

Commutation of taxes.—Sec. 2. That on the 20th day of March, and the 20th day of June and the 20th day of November in such year, the auditor of such county shall compute the amount of taxes collected for such poor fund from the taxpayers of each town, village or city in such county and which then remains in the treasury of such county, and shall draw his warrant in favor of the treasurer of each of such towns, villages and cities for 80 per cent of the amount received from such town, village or city, and the same shall be forthwith paid by the treasurer of such county.

Poor fund constituted.—Sec. 3. The moneys so paid to the treasurers of such towns, villages and cities shall constitute the poor fund for such towns, villages and cities for the year in which such change is made.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
