## CHAPTER 403-H. F. No. 1176.

An Act to amend section forty-nine (49) of chapter three hundred and forty-four (344) of the General Laws of Minnesota for nineteen hundred and five (1905), entitled "An act for the preservation, propagation, protection, taking, use and transportation of game and fish and certain harmless birds and animals."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Nets and seines.—Section 1. That section forty-nine (49) of chapter three hundred and forty-four (344) of the General Laws of Minnesota for nineteen hundred and five (1905), be, and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 49. Fishing in Lake Superior.—Fish of any description, except herring, shall not be caught with nets or seines in the waters of Lake Superior under the jurisdiction of the State of Minnesota between the first day of November and the first day of December following, and no net of any description shall be set or used in the waters of Lake Superiorunder the jurisdiction of Minnesota nearer the shore than onehalf mile. No person shall take, catch or have in possession or under his control for any purpose whatsoever, any sturgeon caught in Lake Superior prior to June 1st, nineteen hundred and ten (1910).

Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred (100) nor more than five hundred (500) dollars, and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) nor more than ninety (90) days for each and every net so used, had or maintained.
